COLLEGE TYPES:

DEFINITIONS:

- Colleges that offer many types of courses in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences
- Higher education institutions that contain several smaller colleges
- Educational Institutions that specialize in fields such as engineering, physical science, and mathematics
- Colleges offering the courses required for an associate's degree. This coursework is designed to be completed in two years of full-time study
- Not-for-profit colleges and universities primarily supported by private funding
- Higher education institutions offering instruction in a specific field such as business or liberal arts
- Colleges with a focus on the visual and performing arts. For admissions, students are judged mostly on their artistic skill or talent
- Not-for-profit colleges and universities primarily supported by government funding
- For-profit colleges and universities
- Programs offered by schools, colleges, agencies, unions and employers that focus on skill training for a specific career or job

College Costs

This document provides an overview of types of colleges and average costs of attending college.

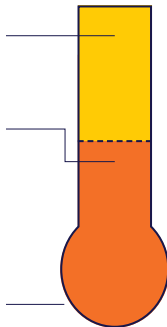


The total cost of attendance includes direct and indirect costs. In order to fully prepare to go to college and career training, you must have a plan to cover both. **Direct costs** are the costs that appear on your bill. These include tuition and fees and in some cases room and board. **Indirect costs** do not appear on your bills but must be covered in order to be successful in college and career training. These include travel to and from the school (metro card, bus ticket, plane ticket), books, supplies, and personal expenses.

CUNY Baruch

- This is a public four-year college.
- It is part of the City University of New York (CUNY system)
- Public institutions offer in-state tuition benefits for in-state residents. This is one way to save money and one great reason to study in NY.

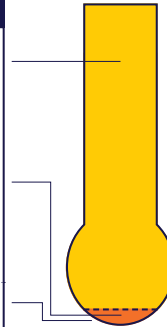

Syracuse University

- This is a private university. The costs represented here are for a student attending a senior college within Syracuse.
- College is expensive but students get a lot from going to college. Data shows that students that complete some type of postsecondary training, make more money and have more job opportunities than students that don't.

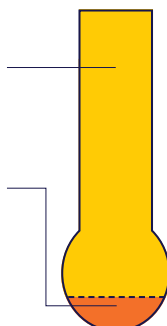

- This is a public university which is part of the State University of New York (SUNY) system.
- The costs represented here are for a student attending SUNY Stony Brook and chances are a student will live in a dorm at this school.

Financial Aid

Grants & Scholarships

This is money provided by the government, private organizations or colleges that doesn't have to be paid back.

Loans

Loans must be paid back and are usually provided by the government but may also be provided by a bank or private organization.

Federal Work Study

This is money from the government that students can earn after finding a job once they are in college.

The Save for College Program

NYC Scholarship Account

NYC Scholarship Accounts are owned and managed by NYC Kids RISE and allow you to receive an initial \$100, earn rewards, and receive contributions from community stakeholders.

Your Family's Savings Account

NYC Kids RISE helps families to open their own savings account and link it to the scholarship account, allowing you to save according to the amount and frequency that is right for you.
